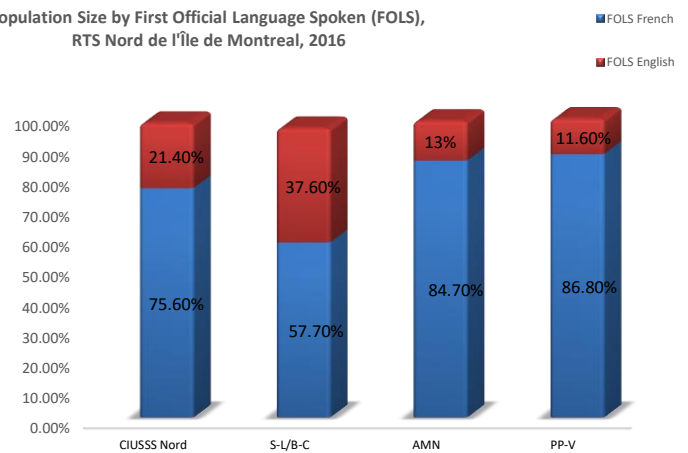

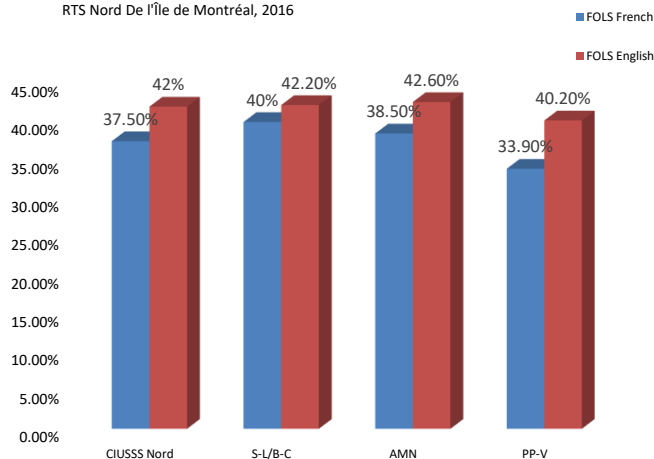
% ENGLISH-SPEAKING POPULATION

RTS Nord de l'île de Montréal, 2016



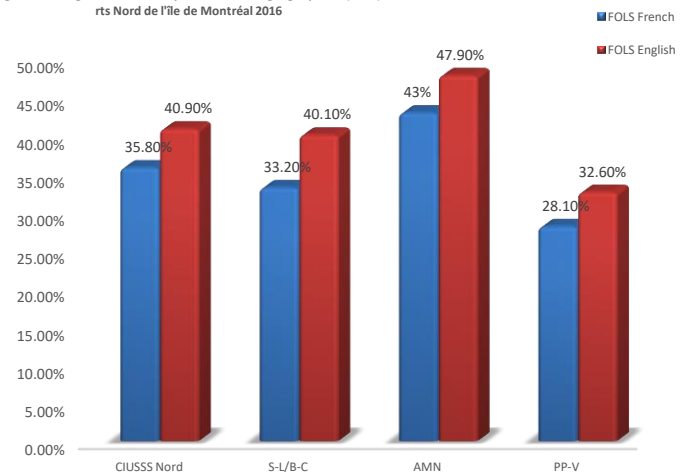
INCOME LESS THAN 20 000\$

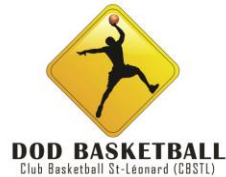
