Training Mandate

- ➤ Program of educational activities adapted and related to targeted social work skills.
- Mentoring support to complement the educational activities.
- ➤ Website enabling information sharing and communication between the various parties involved in the initiative.
- Skills evaluation and recognition of training.





Training in the Context of Intervention

- Victimization following physical and/or sexual abuse
- Mental health problems
- Addiction problems
- Preventive action strategies
- ➤ Under the Youth Protection Act and Youth Criminal Justice Act
- > Stress management
- Working with families





Targeted Social Work Skills

- ➤ Forming a helping relationship (018A)
- Analyzing social legislation (018C)
- Assessing the needs and resources of an individual (018D)
- > Evaluating intervention dilemmas arising from value conflicts (part of 018E)
- Carrying out an interview (018F)
- Carrying out interventions with people in crisis (018W)
