

Put differently, one and one equals three!




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CHSSN Intersectoral Partnerships

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Stages of NPI Partnership Development

Engaging Community

 Sharing information with community members regarding their situation and gaining a bettter understanding of their health and social service needs and priorities

Developing a Strategy

· Establishing NPI goals and identifying potential partners in the region to approach

Knowledge Sharing

- Introducing the CHSSN-NPI Initiative to selected partners
- Sharing knowledge of the community and its situation
- Learning about priorities of our partners institutions/organizations

Partnership Planning

· Identifing activities, clarify roles and responsibilities, possible action plan

Joint Action

Implementing activities/action plan together

Accountablity

- · Reviewing results of joint actions and accountablity back to each other
- Revealing mutual benefits to the partnership

Partnership Expansion

- · Expanding current activities or entry into a new domain of community needs
- · Planning to sustain the partnership into the future
