Objectives: Manage and support the implementation of NPI projects, and engage stakeholders involved with children 0-17 and their families, with the aim of increasing their awareness and knowledge of realities of English-speaking communities as well as encourage adapting practices and services to better reach and support children and families.



Objectives: Bright Beginnings enables NPIs and CHSSN to engage stakeholders offering programs and services to children 0-17 and their families. The aim of these collaborations is to provide new and adapted services to better reach and support English-speaking children and families.****



Objectives: HEY is a Public Health Agency of Canada program that supports early childhood health promotion programming in official language minority communities across Canada. It allows NPIs to develop culturally and linguistically appropriate programs to support families and children (0-6).***

Together Bright Beginnings and Healthy Early Years programs weave a supportive environment for individuals and families, and for organizations, as they strive to support children, youth and families.
