Data Collection Method

Web survey advertised among CHSSN's network of partners as well as social media marketing campaign*



Target Group English-speaking parents of children 0-12 years old (n=1,735) Residents of Quebec 18 years of age or older



Sample Size **1,737 respondents**

Maximum statistical margin of error for a probability sample of this size +/- 2.3% (19 times out of 20)





* The CHSSN has communicated the holding of a survey with its network of partners throughout Quebec and with social media ad placement. Parents were invited to complete the survey at chssnsurvey.ca. A \$100 gift card valid at Indigo was drawn among all participants.



Q. Was it difficult to find the following service in English when you wanted them?





Q. What were the challenges you faced in looking for services in English?







Q. What is your preferred age for your child to start daycare?





Q. Regardless of the language of the service, have you had a hard time finding a place in daycare for one of your children?





Q. It is important to have activities offered in English to support dads.






CONCLUSIONS



- The language of services does matter, particularly when it comes to specialized services or when additional levels of vulnerabilities are added (e.g. being unilingual, low level of education, low-income levels, etc.).
- A high percentage of survey respondents identified a significant lack of services available in English, particularly in the regions.
- The top concerns for parents in accessing services offered by Frenchspeaking services providers are: that it will not be a welcoming environment, that their child will be misunderstood, or that as parents, they will not understand important information provided.
- The inability to find daycare spots for English-speaking children is also affecting the parents' ability to work, with women bearing the largest impact.
- Many parents participating in the survey also indicated increased needs resulting from the pandemic; and the importance of offering more programming and services for dads.
- All of these results highlight the need to improve access to early childhood services for the English-speaking population of Quebec.
